"REGISTRATION"

Registration for this year's Fall Event is \$27.00 per person. **Your "Outpost Registration Form" needs your Pastor's signature in order for your Outpost to attend.** All adults registering must have attended the church for six (6) months and have a "Children's Workers Form" and background check on file at the church.

The following explains who needs to register and those who are "Visitors". In general, anyone staying overnight and/or has "Charge of Boys" must pay the registration fee. Visitors are those who set-up and/or breakdown camp, people making deliveries, parents, and/or special guests visiting on Saturday and/or attending our service. People needing clearance (Pastor's Approval) would be anyone staying overnight, either one (1) or both night(s), and anyone in charge of boys even if they are not camping, e.g., Ranger Kids Leaders. Short-term visitors would not have to register but need to be on your Registration Form for insurance reasons. All other situations would be on a case-by-case basis.

Take **Exit 7A** to I-195 east to Exit 22 - **Turn Left (L)** onto Jackson Mills Road **North (N)** - Follow and **Turn Left (L)** onto Georgia Road and follow for approximately **Two (2)** miles to Nomoco Camping Area - **Turn Left (L)** onto Nomoco Road into Camping Area

From Garden State Parkway:

Take Exit 98 to I-195 **West (W)** to **Exit 22** - **Turn Right(R)** onto Jackson Mills Road **North (N)** - Follow and **Turn Left (L)** onto Georgia Road and follow for approximately **Two (2) miles** to Nomoco Camping - **Turn Left (L)** onto Nomoco Road into Camping Area

From State Highway 9:

In Freehold - **Turn** onto **Route 524 West (Elton-Adelphia Road)** - Follow for about **1.2 miles** and **Turn Left (L)** onto Georgia Road **at the Light** and follow for approximately **Two (2) miles** to Nomoco Camping - **Turn Left (L)** onto Nomoco Road into Camping Area

"OUTPOST REPORTS & FLAG/STAFF"

Formation:

The Senior Guide should carry the Outpost flag

He carries the flag in his right hand to activities and other functions during the Event

When called to "Fall-In":

- The Outpost will "Fall-In" behind the Senior Guide
- He will hold the flag above his head until the entire Outpost is "Present" and has "Falling-IN"
- Rangers will line up as follows:
- Senior Guide RK's Patrol Guide Ranger Kids RK's Assistant Patrol Guide
- The other age groups will "Fall-In" behind the Ranger Kid's in the same fashion
- Commanders will line up at the rear of the Outpost
- After everyone has "Falling-In" He will lower the flag and place it by his right side

The Senior Commander will tell the Senior Guide if all are "Present & Accounted For"

When the Staff Member asks for "The Outpost Report", the Senior Guide will:

- Switch the Outpost flag to his left hand
- Take one (1) step forward
- Salute
- Say: "Outpost # All Present and Accounted for Sir" or as needed

The reporting Commander will return the salute and respond by saying "Thank You"

The Senior Guide will then take one (1) step back, switch the flag to his right hand, and call the outpost to "At Ease".


During Formations and Assemblies, all Rangers and Commanders must be orderly and well behaved, this means silence from all and no horseplay

So, please practice this Formation at your Outpost - *This rule is strictly enforced*

An Outpost with twenty (20) or more Rangers should form two (2) lines

Outpost Flag:

Here are the requirements for your Outpost flag and staff. In purchasing leather, order enough to lap over the crossbar, drape the leather over the cross bar and tie with leather lace or other attachments. Lettering must be on the front and if you like on the back. Use the space at the bottom for an individual design, church name, or leave blank. Add additional items like strings of beans, feathers, etc.



NOTE: Park Rangers Do Frequently and Will Enforce Any Rule(s) as Needed

"CAMPFIRE RULES"

- 1.) All fires are to be in the Fire Rings provided
- 2.) NO holes, digging, and/or ground fires allowed
- 3.) Maintain fires at all times
- 4.) Make sure fires are "Out, Cold, and No Smoke" when leaving camp throughout the weekend
- 5.) **DO NOT** throw ashes or extra wood into the woods or surrounding areas
- 6.) Take extra firewood home or stacked by a tree
- 7.) Leave ashes in the fire ring
- 8.) Have proper "Fire Safety Equipment" (Water, sand, shovel, etc) ready if needed
- 9.) Use the proper method for extinguishing a fire (Sprinkle, Stir, and Sprinkle)
- 10.) Charcoal fires **ONLY** in the barbecue grills
- 11.) **NO** wood fires in barbeque grills
- 12.) Fires are permitted from 7 AM to 11 PM NO fires from 11 PM to 7 AM

Note: If a fire ban is on, be ready to do all the cooking on propane stoves and/or charcoal

"EVENT RULES"

Rules are especially important to the success of our time together Please read them carefully, explain them to your Outpost and obey them Read and obey both the Event and Monmouth County Park System Rules

- 1.) Outpost Responsibility
 - A.) The Senior Commander is the main person responsible for the Outpost
 - 1.) In his absence His next in command or appointed Commander will accept responsibility
 - B.) A Commander needs to be with and know where their boy(s) are at all times
 - C.) No boy(s) should be in the campsite and/or camp alone during Event
 - D.) All Commanders, Rangers, parents, and guests should visit Event activities
 - 1.) Unless someone is sick or given permission by a Staff member to stay in camp
 - E.) All Commanders, Rangers, parents, and guests <u>MUST</u> attend all Services and Church
- 2.) Registration:
 - A.) YOU SHOULD HAVE AN UP-TO-DATE CHARTER TO PARTICIPATE Non-Charted Outpost will pay an additional fee
 - B.) Everyone attending the Network Event from an Outpost must be on the "Outpost Registration Form" for insurance purposes
 - 1.) This includes boys, Commanders, helpers, guests, visitors, and/or parents
 - C.) An Outpost can manage registration before or after setting up camp
 - D.) An Outpost must turn-in a "Outpost Registration Form" signed by their Pastor to attend
 - E.) Ranger insurance covers-chartered Outposts' only
- 3.) Off Limits/Trespassing (Varies with locations):
 - A.) Respect other Outpost's campsites and borders
 - B.) Do not enter other campsites without permission
 - C.) Camping is limited to designated area(s) **ONLY**
- 4.) Propane Fuels use:
 - A.) All usages supervised by a Commander
 - B.) Do not light campfires with liquid fuels
 - C.) Should be stored in a locked container
 - D.) NO liquid fuel is permitted

"EVENT RULES CONTINUES"

5.) Showers procedures (If Available) - No locking doors

- A.) Someone, either a boy(s) or Commander, needs to stand at the door to inform others that the shower(s) are being used
 - 1.) This is for the boy(s) safekeeping and minimizes any horseplay
- B.) This applies to Commander(s) also, not for the horseplay, LOL but for the safety of both you and the boys
 - a.) Ladies 5 pm to 7 pm (Fri-Sat)
 - b.) Commanders 9 pm to 8 am (Fri Sat)

C.) Showers are closed from 8 am to 10 am

- D.) Female attendees should accompany each other when traveling and/or at the shower house for safety reasons
- E.) Please keep ALL showers clean after you are done
- F.) All adults/leaders should be checking the showers after a boy is done showering to check for cleanliness

6.) Miscellaneous

- A.) All boys Must have their "Cut & Chop Card" when using and/or carrying a knife, axe, or bow saw
- B.) **NO** digging allowed in the camping area(s) and/or parade field(s)
- C.) **NO** driving allowed on any of the camping grounds and/or parade fields
- D.) Unload all equipment in the parking area and transport it by wagon or cart to your designated campsite
- E.) **NO** sleeping in any cabin
- F.) Cabins can be used for storage, meeting, and/or emergencies **ONLY**
- G.) **ANY** additional Recreational Activities like football, baseball, etc **NEED** to be conducted in the Activities Fields **NOT** the campsites

7.) Vehicles

- A.) All vehicles **MUST** park in the designated parking areas with approved "Parking Pass"
- B.) Six (6) "Parking Passes" will be issued per Campsite
- C.) Additional vehicles need to park in the designated parking lots
- D.) Two (2) trailers will be allowed in a campsite
- E.) NO driving on any camping grounds and/or parade fields
- F.) All equipment is to be unloaded in the parking area and carted to your designated campsite
- G.) NO RV's or Campers are permitted
- H.) CAMP SPEED LIMIT WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED Speed Limit is posted at the Camp entrance

8.) Emergencies/Evacuations

- A.) Upon notification stop everything immediately, secure items as needed quickly, assist in moving everyone quickly to the designated location while the Staff will manage any situation(s)
- B.) The responsibility for your boy's safety lies with you and is most important
- C.) Locations
 - 1.) Minor events Thunderstorm(s) and lightning
 - a.) Move boys and Commanders to the nearest shelter
 - 2.) Major events High wind and heavy rains
 - a.) Move boys and Commanders to a building

9.) Ladies presence

- A.) We need to be aware of the presence of ladies in camp
- B.) Commander(s) please be aware of our speech and actions
- C.) The Outposts' Pastor and Commander's wives need to know that ladies are present and may be staying overnight
- D.) They need to meet all the requirements like a Commander Background Check, Pastor's signature, etc

"EVENT RULES CONTINUES"

10.) Escorts

- A.) Boys need to be escorted to locations not in the immediate area of the campsite
 - 1.) Showers, lakefront, activities, etc
- B.) Escort(s) are Commander's, parent's, guardian's, and/or adult helper's
- C.) All escorts must be at least twenty-one (21) years old
- D.) No one-on-one escorts (Adult and boy or Male and Female)
- E.) Ladies
 - 1.) One (1) additional female or two (2) male commanders
 - 2.) **NO** walking alone

11.) Trash & Recycling information:

- A.) Place all trash in the containers provided with additional trash bagged and placed on the ground next to the containers
- B.) Place all recycling in the containers provided with additional bags placed next to the containers
- C.) You MUST take home ALL Archway and Activity materials and/or any damaged equipment

12.) Checking Out Time is **Noon** on Sunday

- A.) Pick-up and remove all trash from your campsite(s) and surrounding area(s)
- B.) Remove all Event related items from the camp
 - 1.) This includes yellow tape, ropes, tables, chairs, tarps, archways, entranceways, and activity materials
- C.) Take unused firewood home, stack along tree line, or the base of a tree
- D.) Have a Staff Member check your campsite

Note: A Royal Ranger always leaves the area in a natural looking setting and cleaner than when he arrived

Rules & Regulations General Summary for Monmouth County Park System

The Monmouth County Park System asks Park visitors to observe the following regulations:

- In accordance with New Jersey's Smoke Free Air Act, all Monmouth County parks are tobacco free

 The ban applies to cigarettes, pipes, cigars, e-cigarettes, and vaporize cigarettes, as well as smokeless tobacco such as snuff and chew
- Leave all flowers, plants, animals and other natural features as they are found
- Containers for recyclable items and trash are placed near the entrances of the parks
 When on trails, carry-out all trash and put glass, aluminum, and bi-metal cans in the correct containers.
- Possessing or consuming alcoholic beverages is not permitted in any Monmouth County Park System Park
- Pets must be on leashes and under control.
 - Each pet owner is responsible for his/her pet
 - Pets are not permitted in garden areas, at historic sites, on beaches, in park buildings, or as posted Leader/Service dogs for persons with disabilities ARE permitted in all areas
 - Dogs are not permitted to swim at ANY Monmouth County Park System facility
- Groups of fifty (50) or more need to obtain a group use permit seven)7) days prior to the date of use Group use is limited to designated areas
 - Adult supervision of children's groups is required
- Meetings, concerts, or public entertainment may not be held without written permission seven (7) days prior to use
- Loudspeaker, public address systems, or amplifiers may not be used without written permission seven (7) days prior to use. Any audio device, video device, or musical instrument should not be played in such a manner as to create a nuisance or any two-way radio, communication device or cellular phone should not create a nuisance

"EVENT COUNCIL FIRE RULES"

- 1.) Follow the rules of the Ushers
- 2.) Enter the Council Fire area quietly and remain quiet until instructed otherwise
- 3.) This is a time of "Praise and Worship to the LORD" Please respect it accordingly
- 4.) Participate in the Worship Service
- 5.) An Outpost is to sit together
- 6.) Ushers will notify an Outpost Commander of any distraction or unruly boys
- 7.) Please, extinguish, and leave off all flashlights after seating
- 8.) Please, remain respectful during the closing portion(s) of the Council Fire

If you need to leave: Please leave quietly and respectfully for those who are praying or seeking the LORD for HIS Salvation and/or the HOLY SPIRIT

"GENERAL EVENT RULES"

- 1.) Campers must remain in camp:
 - A.)Do not sneak out
 - B.) Those found outside the camp will be sent home
- 2.) Obey site safety rules (Campfires, swimming, parking, etc.) and ground rules (Cleanup, recycling, and garbage)
- 3.) Be respectful in conduct and language
- 4.) Be involved by attending all Activities and being on time
- 5.) Leaders should always know where their boys are at all times
- 6.) Be careful not to damage and/or deface Camp property
 - A.) Any unnecessary damage will be charged to the person(s) responsible
- 7.) Tobacco, drugs, alcohol, and unauthorized weapons as well as harassment, intimidation, bullying, and assault of any kind will not be tolerated.
 - A.) You might also be explaining things to local law enforcement.




